This was accomplished through too many efforts to list in this space which involved caring deeply about people, being active in the community, and instilling a sense of God-honoring excellence in all that we do.

What areas of growth have you identified in yourself?

I have recently grown in my understanding of factors which influence my self-motivation for any given task. Typically I am a highly achieving multi-tasker who utilizes the many results-oriented problem solving skills I learned in my business education and management experience. However, occasionally I find myself mired over making progress in one area or another which is disconcerting given my usual thoroughness.

In analyzing such situations I've realized that when there are no clear solutions I tend to have difficulty finding motivation to be persistent in completing them. Therefore, I am currently exploring new ways to utilize others to assist me with the things which I find to be stumbling blocks.

Describe a time when you have led change.

I was pastor in a church which due to previous decisions only had three committees. This led to each committee being responsible for a large amount of ministry areas and tasks, and I found that far too many areas received little or no attention. Also, members were hesitant to serve on the committees because the scope of their duties were overwhelming. An additional issue was that there were some tasks in the church which no committee had oversight of. Through a session planning retreat, we listed all of the various activities and tasks that happened in the congregation throughout a given year. The list was long, and we categorized them by their frequency (ongoing, weekly, monthly,

seasonal, etc). We developed a new nine-committee structure with each committee being able to be more focused on specific ministry areas or events when they met. We found that members were more willing to serve in such a way and in addition often served in more than one area.

The result was that we had more meetings, but they were shorter and more productive than previously and we had much more participation and ownership of the mission and ministry we were carrying out.

We are sanctified to a fuller life by the Holy Spirit, sent to guide and comfort us. Through the power of the Spirit we are able to have a faithful relationship with God and participate in the Church that is the Body of Christ.

Jesus instituted sacraments which we celebrate as visible signs of an invisible grace – baptism and the Lord's Supper. In baptism we confirm inclusion in the covenant of grace with God which precedes our response. Through the waters of baptism we die and rise again with Christ, renouncing sin and evil. The common bread and wine in communion represent the body and blood of Christ as signs and seals. By the power of the Spirit, we are renewed and caught up to Heaven and experience the real presence of Christ with the Church.

Jesus Christ is the head of the Church, which is a living organism that spans all times and places. As part of the visible body of Christ, we claim no special power or authority of our own, but ascribe all glory to the God of grace. As Christians we are called to respond to that grace, proclaiming the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ and working for justice and love in the world. We do this through worship, nurture, and mission. All that we have ultimately belongs to God and we must live lives of gratitude and generosity as we strive to be good stewards of the gifts bestowed upon us. However, we are saved from our sin by the grace of God through our faith, not by what we do. Jesus is Lord and Savior

and we endeavor to rely on the power of the Holy Spirit in response to the gift of eternal life as faithful servants, sharing the Good News and the love which comes from God.
